PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Firstly, I would like to express my gratitude to Debbie for offering to produce this NBC newsletter. The dedication and commitment involved in distributing news, events and upcoming events for NBC members is acknowledged and appreciated by all members of the NBC board. There will be several events conducted over the course of the off season; please support these efforts and join in the fun and help raise much needed funds for planned improvements at the club. Updates are posted on Facebook regularly.

I would also like to express my thanks to those members of the NBC who have played a vital part in modernizing and improving Club house amenities over the last couple of years. They include:

- The BBQ and surrounds at little cost to the club. This
 improvement, it must also be pointed out, resulted in a new
 major sponsor for the club.
- The removal of trees and up-grade of the car parking area at the rear of the club at almost no cost to the Club.
- The recent upgrading of Club lighting inside and out to full LED, enabling substantial savings in electricity usage and at a cost of \$600. The full cost would have been around \$4,000.
- The new bar window, a cost covered by the club in this
 instance, however, volunteers did assist in this much needed
 upgrade and reduced the impact on club funds.
- A new touchless water dispenser to be plumbed in at the front
 of the club to replace the old water bottles and trollies etc. This
 has been donated by a club member, the cost to the club for
 the plumbing only minimal cost to NBC.
- Internal upgrade of the club including covering the old brick wall, painting and rearranging trophies and honor boards, not to forget our new large screen TV, plus a low cost but high impact upgrade and cleanup of the bar area. These improvements have had a massive impact on the amenities within the NBC and those responsible deserve a huge pat on the back and a well-earned cold beer or two! Clearly there has been a cost to the club for these improvements, however, due to the generosity of sponsors and a few individuals within the club in-terms of labor and cash or cash in kind, the total cost to the club has been very modest in comparison to the impact these improvements have made. I would also like to add that because of these improvements a new major sponsor has offered to make a cash contribution of \$1500 in installments prior to the start of the season with a bonus contribution of \$1000 to the club should any NBC division win a pennant in the

LAWN BOWLS ETIQUETTE

MOVING ON TO THE MAT

 Wait until the bowler, before you, has delivered his or her bowl and it has come to rest before moving onto the mat.



- Once it is your turn to bowl, come onto the mat from the left side and once you are done bowling, step off from the right side of the mat. It is customary to observe this suggestion to avoid bumping into other players as you exit the mat.
- When it's your team's turn to bowl, it's your mat and head; your opponents should be away from both but if they are not, ask them politely, to move.
- Give your skipper time to give you directions before delivering your bowl.
