
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I would like to take this opportunity to wish all NBC members and sponsors a very Merry Christmas and a happy and peaceful New Year. Your generous support and encouragement are much appreciated and I can assure you that our Board of hardworking volunteers is continually looking at improving our facilities, the promoting of

our valuable sponsors' businesses and the enjoyment of the great sport of lawn bowls. May Santa fill your stockings to the brim and your home be filled with the joys of Christmas.

As we take a well-earned break, spend some quality time with our families, and recharge the batteries in preparation for the recommencement of the season in the New Year, I would like to reflect on what has been a very intense period of activity at the NBC and share a little on what we have in store for the near future. The Board has, over the past season or so, overseen the following investments in the amenities at the NBC -:

- The establishment of the best BBQ facility in the association with the bonus of attracting a new major sponsor; all done with little direct cost to NBC.
- Major improvement/upgrade of the parking area to the rear of the club, once again all done at little direct cost to NBC.
- Completed a substantial upgrade to the interior of the club, with a new-look bar, kitchen improvements, large screen TV, painting and the reorganization of the dining area of the Club. Whilst there was some capital invested it must be acknowledged that much of this was accomplished via the generous assistance and time of volunteers.
- Invested in a much needed upgrade of a new audio and visual system. A
 huge improvement over our previous system! Better still is the fact that the
 work was completed by a local Barossa business, a great example of NBC
 supporting local business wherever possible.
- The substantial investment in the installation of a fully automated sprinkler system on both the A and B greens, resulting in a reduction in labour Requirements, better volunteer safety and reduced water usage. We are the only club in the association with grass greens to have this system in place, something we should be proud of! Once again, I am very happy to report that a local Barossa business was supported through this investment. In conjunction with expert guidance from Graetz Irrigation and the club members who helped install the system, a massive well done to all involved.

• The upgrade of the electrical systems, with all lighting within the club now converted to halogen. This improvement will reduce costs, improve the ambiance and was done at a considerably reduced cost due to a government incentive.

• The installation of a roller shutter in the kitchen, with a local business benefiting from this

investment.

In closing, I would also like to advise that the work hasn't stopped!

We await news on two massive developments for NBC; one being the potential for receiving a positive response from our state grant application for the installation a synthetic green and secondly, the potential for a grant approval for the purchase of a new commercial quality double glass door fridge for our kitchen via the Barossa Council. Could be a massive 2024!!

Once again, many thanks to those sponsors, board members, members and volunteers who have all generously devoted time, energy, and capital into ensuring the long-term viability and success of the Nuriootpa Bowling Club both now and into the future so that we can continue to provide a quality venue for the enjoyment of the local community, business and service providers, individuals, and families alike. KNOW THE RULES

Laws of the Sport of Bowls - Crystal Mark Fourth Edition

7 Position on the mat

- 7.1 Before delivery a player must be standing on the mat with all or part of at least one foot on the mat. At the moment they deliver the **jack or a bowl**, the player must have all or part of one foot **on or above** the mat.
- 7.2 Before delivery a player using an approved wheelchair must have one wheel on the mat and, at the moment they deliver the jack or a bowl, the player must have all or part of one wheel on or above the mat.
- 7.3 Any player not meeting the terms of this law is committing a foot-fault, and law 8 will apply.

8 Foot-faulting

- 8.1 If the umpire, either by their own observation or on appeal by one of the skips or opponents in Singles, decides that a player has not met the terms of law 7, the umpire must, on the first occasion, warn the player in the presence of the skip and advise the coach when they are present that a warning has been given.
- 8.2 On each occasion after this, the umpire must have the player's bowl stopped and declared dead.
- 8.3 If it has not been possible to stop the bowl and it disturbs the head, the opposing skip or opponent in Singles must choose whether to:

8.3.1 replace the head; 8.3.2 leave the head as altered; or 8.3.3 declare the end dead.



Nuriootpa Bowling Club Greens after the March 1983 floods!


A bit of cleaning up to do there. Is that you, Robert Grope in the background??
